and is implementing an integrated course in Drug Development Sciences modelled on the PharmaTrain Syllabus. Teaching is done at the Guy's or Waterloo Campus with a balanced mixture of academic and industry experts.

As much as possible is taught by syndicate project work where students have to work cooperatively on a programme throughout the module, e.g. in the clinical trial module they have to decide which indication to develop and then design a phase 2 study. They then get the data back and have to carry out a statistical analysis and present it back. This allows the students to experience real world problems and work on solutions under the guidance of the teaching staff.
